

Tips for Children on Internet Safety



- Do not give out too much information online, such as your home address & mobile phone number.
- Protect your privacy from strangers by using privacy settings.
- Report any abuse to parents, teachers or family members immediately
- Block people from your profile if they are taunting you and report it.
- Take photos of onscreen messages when abuse happens
- Don't organise to meet up with someone you just met online.
- Maintain the same manners and adherence to interaction with people online as you would if you met them on the street.
- Not everything online is true, make sure to verify any information with more sources online or offline.
- When posting images online, make sure the people in the picture will not be embarrassed or hurt with your actions. If you're not sure, DON'T POST!
- Click on the LIKE or SHARE button is the same as writing a comment yourself. If the police get involved, you may also be in trouble
- It can be hard to remove information online. Even when deleted it may still be found on Google later on.
- Do not share your passwords for any logons.
- Careful when creating usernames for chat rooms or websites. Do not give full name.
